

From the Pastor



As of the writing of this *Messenger* article, we're already more than halfway through the season of Lent. The seasons of the church year, much like any other ebb-and-flow within our lives, they take *forever* to arrive, but then they are over before we know it.

So, let's take a moment together. Take a deep breath and exhale. Pause and reflect. How is your journey through Lent to the Great Three Days going? With fewer days remaining in Lent than have already gone by, where are you in your Lenten experience? Ask yourself: Am I over it? Did I try and fail? Do I have still have work to do? Did I take on a new discipline? Am I deeply committed to a new discipline of faith, or did I abandon my discipline all together at the first lure of temptation? Am I discovering the fruitful depths of faith that I never knew existed?

The work of Lent is challenging, vulnerable work and, for better or worse, it'll be over before we know it. We knowingly and intentionally enter a season of mortality and penitence, acknowledging our sinful nature by naming the pieces of our life that cause us to turn from God and perish. It is difficult and faithful work. Self-discernment and introspection are not our favorite hobbies. We rarely enjoy naming our faults, fears, or shortcomings, especially when it comes to faith.

This is why we gather for worship a bit more often during the season of Lent. The community gathers not only to hear the stories of our faith and be reminded of God's grace in our self-discernment, but we gather also to support one another. We gather in worship to build each other up, hold one another accountable, and celebrate the power of faith to heal, restore, and make whole. The Spirit gathers us together a bit more than usual to remember that our faith is communal and rooted in relationship.

On Wednesday nights, the Spirit has been gathering us for mid-week dinner and worship. We explore our own restless nature within ourselves, with our neighbors, with the world, and with God. Space is created to empower the community of faith in your journey through Lent together. Join your siblings for dinner (5:00-5:30) and worship (6:40-7:20) and be supported.

During Holy Week the Spirit will gather us for worship on multiple occasions. We begin with Palm/Passion Sunday (4/14 @ 9:30. We'll walk the stations of the cross on Wednesday (4/17 @ 12:00). We'll gather on Maundy Thursday (4/18 @ 7:00) for Eucharist, foot washing, and the stripping of the altar. We'll gather on Good Friday (4/19 @ 7:00) to hear the passion narrative and remember Christ's death on the cross. We'll gather for Easter Vigil (4/20 @ 7:00) to hear again the stories of our faith and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord.

These services are important because they remember and celebrate the foundation of our faith—that Christ became incarnate, died on the cross, and rose again so that all may have life and have it abundantly. We hear these stories all the time and we *know* them well. We *know* the story of Jesus' passion and Holy week. We *know* the stories of Jesus washing the disciples' feet, Judas' betrayal, and Peter's denial. We *know* the stories. And yet, we never stop telling them. We don't gather for all of Holy Week because that's what we've always done or because we don't know what expect. We gather to proclaim the stories of our faith and we do so as a community of believers. Our relationship with one another is an essential witness to the proclamation of God's abundant love made on those nights. I hope you are able to join us.

That being said, life happens. We cannot always be with our siblings in Christ. We are not always able to be present for worship, especially the "extra" services in seasons like Lent. That is ok. The power and gift of a community of faith is that when the Spirit calls us together, we gather on behalf of the whole. The community worships, not without

you, but on your behalf. The body of Christ prays, sings, repents, and worships when you cannot. The community weeps, grieves, and rejoices when you cannot. So, if you cannot be present, know that your community of faith gathers on your behalf. And wherever you are during those nights, take a moment. Take a deep breath and exhale. Pause and reflect. Worship is taking place and, by the power of the waters of Baptism, you are present. The stories of God's grace and love are being proclaimed. Thanks be to God, you are being prayed for and remembered.

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's,

Your Congregation Council met on March 25 and the following items were discussed:

1. We reviewed estimates for the replacement of the main water supply line and approved a repair to begin as soon as possible. The leak has gotten worse and is causing excessive water bills.
2. If the water main replacement is accomplished as budgeted, we will have approximately \$23,000 to spend on other matters. Larry Wertz is gathering estimates and we will approve a plan at next month's meeting. The next candidates for repair/replacement/upgrade are the roof on the music suite and miscellaneous beautification projects around the property, including continued renovations in the restrooms.
3. Work on the organization and the appearance of the library has resumed. Keep watching for changes!
4. Larry Wertz needs some assistance on the Property Committee. Men who have some handyman skills would be very much appreciated. As we perform beautification projects, there are colors and styles to select for paint, flooring, window treatments, etc. Anyone who has a flair for decorating is invited to let Larry know that they are available for assistance in making these decisions.
5. By the time you read this article, Saint Mark's will have hosted the Leadership and Vitality Retreat! As I write this article, at least 8 congregations are planning to send participants.
6. Our next Council meeting will be held on Monday, April 29 at 6:00 pm. Any member is welcome to attend that meeting. If you would like to address the Council on any subject, please contact me by email at least one week in advance of the meeting. In the meanwhile, if you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to call me. Your Council is here to serve you!


